PROGRAM SUMMARY

In Tuolumne County, GEO Reentry Services provides a comprehensive program tailored to meet individual participant's risk and needs. At the foundation of our approach is a cognitive behavioral programming designed to address criminogenic needs as identified through the assessment process. The program model at the Tuolumne County Day Reporting Center (DRC) includes Moral Reconciliation Therapy® (MRT), Individual Cognitive Behavioral Interventions (ICBI), life skills, substance use group, employment and education orientation, onsite job and career fairs, financial literacy courses, parenting skills, a Batterers' Intervention program, virtual and onsite family events, and community connections.

The following reflects the annual (January 1, 2024-December 31, 2024) program data and intermediate outcomes for the Tuolumne County DRC in California.

PARTICIPANTS SERVED

70 Participants served during the reporting period

AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

29 Average number of participants in the program per day

STARTING POINTS

45 Participants started the program during the reporting period

DOSAGE HOURS



TOTAL DISCHARGES: 55




■ Positive Completion: includes successful completion discharges, agency-ordered terminations, external transfers, and other discharges

EMPLOYMENT

A goal of the DRC is to assist participants in securing employment and/or enrolling in school. During the reporting period, the number of participants employed increased by 140%, based on the total individuals discharged. (n=55)

HOUSING

A goal of the DRC is to assist participants in securing stable housing. During the reporting period, the number of housed participants increased by 20%. (n=70)

DRUG & ALCOHOL TEST RESULTS

DRC participants are required to test for alcohol and illicit substances. Below is the breakdown of negative and positive test results during the reporting period.

TOTAL DRUG TESTS: 791




In addition, below is the breakdown of negative and positive drug test results by phase. As participants progressed through the phases, the percentage of clean drug tests increased.

CRIMINOGENIC NEEDS ASSESSMENT RESULTS

The DRC uses the Correctional Assessment and Intervention System (CAIS), a supervision model that combines a risk and needs assessment in one face-to-face assessment interview. CAIS provides concrete supervision strategies in five categories and recommends interventions most likely to produce success and recidivism reduction. The research-based risk assessment has been employed and validated widely across the U.S. Below are the top criminogenic needs identified during the reporting period. (n=13)

TOP CRIMINOGENIC NEEDS

1. Behavioral characteristics
2. Attitudes, values, and beliefs
3. Education/employment
4. Substance use

COMMUNITY RESOURCE REFERRALS

During the reporting period, the DRC provided 108 valuable resource referrals to assist with participant stabilization in the community. The top resources included:

- 36 Travel Documentation
- 21 Employment
- 8 Transportation
- 7 Support Groups
- 6 Housing
