PROGRAM SUMMARY

In Cambria County, GEO Reentry Services provides comprehensive programs tailored to meet individual participant's risk and needs. At the foundation of our approach is cognitive behavioral programming designed to address criminogenic needs as identified through the assessment process. The program model at the Cambria County Reentry Service Center (RSC) includes Moral Reconciliation Therapy® (MRT), the Ohio Risk Assessment System (ORAS) risk/needs assessment, Substance Use Disorder (SUD) education, Batterers' Intervention, life skills, employment readiness, anger management, parenting, transportation assistance, drug testing, and community connections.

The following reflects annual (January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025) program data and intermediate outcomes for the Cambria County RSC in Pennsylvania.

PARTICIPANTS SERVED

332 Participants served during the reporting period

AVERAGE DAILY POPULATION

76 Average number of participants in the program per day

REFERRALS

120 Participant referrals received from the agency during the reporting period

STARTING POINTS

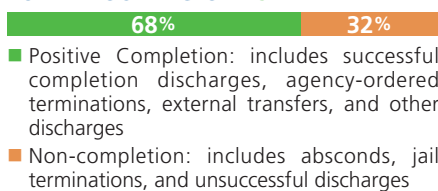
120 Participants started the program during the reporting period

83 Participants graduated the program during the reporting period

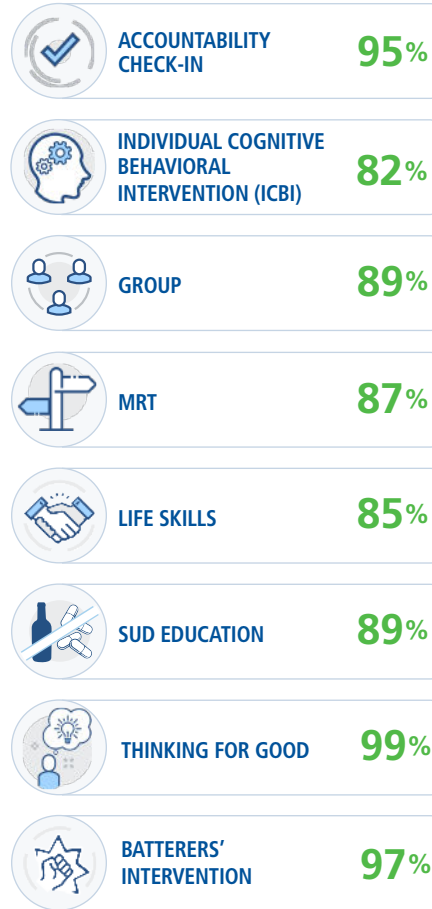
DISCHARGE RESULTS

"The staff made coming here less stressful and made me feel safe and able to talk about anything."

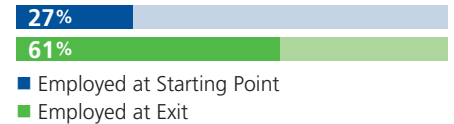
"I believe it takes a village to help someone complete and succeed in this program. Every single staff member plays an important role in our sobriety and success."

EMPLOYMENT

A goal of the RSC is to assist participants in securing employment and/or enrolling in school. During the reporting period, the number of participants employed increased by 126% based on the total number of graduates. (n=83)

DRUG & ALCOHOL TEST RESULTS

RSC participants are required to test for alcohol and illicit substances. Below is the breakdown of negative and positive test results during the reporting period.

TOTAL DRUG TESTS: 3,429

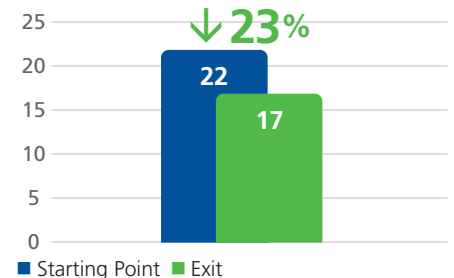


TOTAL BREATH ALCOHOL CONTENT (BrAC) TESTS: 15,149



ORAS RISK REDUCTION ASSESSMENT RESULTS

During the reporting period, programming at the RSC helped participants reduce their risk scores by an average of 23%, which correlates to a similar reduction in the probability of recidivism.¹ (n=83)



COMMUNITY RESOURCE REFERRALS

During the reporting period, the RSC provided 482 valuable resource referrals to assist with participant stabilization in the community. Referral types included:
